



Sun Young Kang, 祥遇 상우 Sang-woo, 2024. 10 x 8 in. Letterpress print.




HyeYoon Song, *rite of passage*, 2024. 10 x 8 in. Photopolymer etching with chine collé and screen print.

Ogansaek

오간색 (Ogansaek) is an artist book produced by Hanji Edition in 2024. It features a series of hanji prints by five Korean American artists who use different colors (violet, teal, ochre, green, and burnt orange), derived from the five traditional colors of Korea (red, white, black, blue, and yellow), to explore contemporary themes of diasporic culture and historic symbols found in East Asian philosophy: the cardinal directions and their associated colors, Yin-Yang and Five Element Theory, mythical animals, and their combined cultural significance.
